





John Berteaux:

WHITHER NOW INDIVIDUALISM, MULTICULTURALISM, ASSIMILATIONISM OR COSMOPOLITIANISM



Berteaux questions the import and politics of race and racism within the tradition of individualist liberalism. Berteaux examines the "inheritance" of race and discusses how that inheritance is mutated by the lived experience of aggrieved racial groups. Being critical of both classical individualist liberalism and group supremacy, John Berteaux, discusses how we, as a society, need a deeper, more inclusive, fine grained, sensitive understanding of race and racism.

John Berteaux is a member of the CSUMB Philosophy faculty teaching Philosophy, Diversity, Justice, Social Ethics, and Biomedical Ethics. John is a Fellow of the Institute for Ethics and Public Affairs at San Diego State University. In 1999 he won the Outstanding Faculty Award for Thurgood Marshall College, University of California at San Diego. He was recognized as the Most Influential Faculty, College of Arts & Letters, San Diego State University in 2002 and received the James Hervey Johnson Fellowship while at San Diego State University in 2004.

Douglas Smith: ${f A}$ GEOLOGIST'S PERSPECTIVE ON CLIMATE CHANGE, SEA LEVEL CHANGE, AND COASTAL RETREAT



There is a great deal of misconception and panic about climate change, sea level change, and their societal impacts. These phenomena can be best understood in the context of what we know about the past 2 million years of Earth history. When one takes the longer view, it becomes clear that global change is the norm rather than the exception.

Dr. Douglas Smith is an environmental scientist using a suite of technologies to teach and learn about Earth's natural and managed systems. He is known for interdisciplinary work applying geology, hydrology, and marine geology to solve environmental problems.

more. Patrick is currently working on a book that deals with the aesthetic and technical issues presented by digital creative arts on our cultural consciousness.



This course explores and celebrates American women's poetic voices, from Emily Dickinson to our own Professor Mossberg. Lectures, readings, and class discussions will look at how women's lives-as daughters, mothers, friends, lovers, leaders--translate into Truth and Beauty through their art, and relate to and inspire each of our own lives. Mossberg is known as a scholar and lecturer of American studies and literature worldwide, including for Stein and Plath, on whom she recently lectured at Oxford University. She has twice held the prestigious Bicentennial Chair of American Studies at the University of Helsinki as the Senior Fulbright Distinguished Lecturer, and the Senior Fulbright American Poetry Seminar at the University of Rome. She directs the Integated Studies program and is professor of of First Year Seminar at CSUMB.

FAMOUS FLYING ACES OF WWI

WWI air combat was aggressive, primitive and personal. Attacking Pilots could often see the faces of their adversaries during fights. This class uses presentations, film, and group discussions to explore the careers of some of the top flying aces from World War I. 

WATER POLICY – THE WET SIDE AND THE DRY SIDE

"Whisky is for drinking, and water is for fighting over." - Mark Twain

As California continues to grow at a pace of 500,000 persons per annum, the battles over water will continue to be front and center on the public policy stage. As concern about global climate change grows, and solutions are sought, water will be one of three major topics within that emerging public policy debate and search for solutions. This offering will be presented in six sessions.

CALIFORNIA WATER HISTORY, POLICY, PLANNING, AND POLITICS: First, there will be two sessions concerning California water history, policy, planning and politics. These two sessions will reach back to the initial founding days of California, and track water history through the mid-1800's to today. This will be the foundation for understanding the second and third sections of this offering.

CENTRAL COAST WATER ISSUES: Second, there will be two sessions concerning how such history, policies, planning and politics impact the topic of water in the Central Coast, especially in Monterey County and Santa Cruz County. This is the "dry side" of the water issue in that it is on the land, as opposed to the ocean.

CENTRAL COAST MARINE ISSUES: Third, there will be two sessions concerning coastal and marine issues. This is the "wet side" of the water issue. These two sessions will focus on marine policy, including the Marine Life Management Act of 1998, and the Marine Life Protection Act of 1999, which led to the recent adoption of 29 Marine Protected Areas, covering 204 square miles along the Central Coast. From 1996 through 2002, Mr. Keeley represented the Monterey Bay area in the California State Assembly. Mr. Keeley served as Speaker pro Tempore for three Speakers, a record in the term-limited era of the legislature. Mr. Keeley authored the Marine Life Management Act of 1998, and was principal co-author of the Marine Life Management Act of 1999. Mr. Keeley also authored the two largest park and environmental protection bonds in the nation's history (Proposition 12 in 2000, and Proposition 40 in 2002). Mr. Keeley established through legislation in 2002.






